"The Good News"

I'll never forget the sight of the children and women navigating the winding, hilly, narrow pathways from the river to their homes, carrying buckets of water for the family needs, often balanced on heads. I was a young man in Haiti, experiencing for the first time life in a "third world" country, or developing nation. To a visitor, the toting of water may have looked quaint, but to the women and children, it was just heavy. Imagine carrying such a weight not as strength training, but for survival. Think of the ongoing pressure/ damage to the spine, hips, legs, and feet. Imagine how vulnerable these women and children are to predatory people on their daily journey. I didn't think of all that as a young man, but I do now.

On Saturday June 1st at Hudson Crossing Park at 9 am, you are invited to walk because they walk. We will walk (or run or roll) 6 kilometers (3.7 miles) along the Fox River, to symbolize a typical distance that women and children must walk multiple times per day to bring typically dirty water to their family for cooking, drinking, and cleaning. The good news for us is we will not be carrying water on our heads. Instead, our sacrifice will be to raise money to provide permanent access to clean water for women and children around the world so they don't have to skip school or leave home for something that we need only to turn on a faucet to receive.

If you're not able to join us for the walk/ run on June 1st, you can still use the link provided to make a donation in the name of one of our participants listed on the roster. To walk, run, or roll, click on the link below to allow you to change a life. With your \$50 registration, one person will receive permanent access to clean water. Last year we had 50 people participate in this joyful, hope-giving event. Come join the party!

May God's grace guide us during this Lenten journey.

I write to thank you for the gift of your faithfulness as your congregation paid 100% of its conference and general church apportionment! Your dedication demonstrates a commitment that is deeply Wesleyan: we share for the good of the whole mission, engaged in the name of Christ. God is in mission with us—and does not hold back. At our March Unit Meeting, as part of the program, Grace Circle asked us to bring baby items for the Kendall County Community Food Pantry. Thanks to all who gave towards this project.

At our March UWFaith Unit Meeting, I challenged the ladies to join the UWFaith Reading Program and read five books this year. I was very excited to have some ladies agree to take the challenge. Anyone could join this challenge, even if you're not a member of UWFaith. One book must be read from each of the following categories:

Education for Mission ~ Leadership Development ~ Nurturing for Community ~ Social Action & Spiritual Growth

In addition or except reading books, you may receive credit by listening to *Faith Talks* podcast and *Voices from the Field* podcast which can be found at uwfaith.org, under Resources click on Podcasts & Webinars. Another option is to watch movies that are based on books in the reading program. *Hidden Figures, Pushout,* and *The Hate U Give* are movies that would count in the category that the books come from. The three are available through the Oswego Public Library in DVD or eVideo.

Books and copies of *response* magazine are available on the two top library shelves on the left side of the library in the Gathering Room. For 2024 Reading Program any book from 2019 -2024 can be counted. In the library next to the *response* magazines, you may find the 2024 Reading Program document that lists the books along with their descriptions. You may also find a total list of the book names with authors from 2019 through 2024. When you check out a book, please put the card in the small box marked UWFaith that is on our UWFaith reading shelf. When you check out a *response* magazine, please record the information in the notebook with the magazines. To qualify for a certificate from the Prairie District UWFaith, you must read *response* magazine in addition to the five books.



I am currently working on a list of all the 2024 books that Oswego Public Library has available either in book, eBook or audio form. If you're interested in the list or having your own 2024 Reading Program, please contact me and I'd be glad to give you a copy.

Some new titles will be added to our library during the year which are not available through the

Oswego Public Library. If you see a book that you'd like to read that's in the Program, let me know. I'm looking for suggestions.



United Methodist Church Council of Bishops calling for ceasefire in Gaza

"Blessed are the peacemakers for they shall be called the children of God"

Matthew 5:9 NLT

As bishops of The United Methodist Church, we call for an immediate and permanent cease-fire in the conflict between Hamas and Israel in Gaza and pledge our prayers and commitment to work for a durable peace for Israelis, Palestinians, and all in the region.

As United Methodists, we join others in encouraging, "...diplomatic initiatives that will engage both Israelis and Palestinians in an effort to understand the fears, hopes, and aspirations of each other. Such strategies should actively seek a way to promote a just and lasting peace and cooperation that will lead to a two-State solution...an end to the current occupation and violence, and the creation of a viable Palestinian state living side by side in peace with Israel..."1

On October 7, 2023, an attack by Hamas left 1,200 Israelis dead and hundreds of hostages taken. Since then, more than 30,000 have been killed by Israel's bombardment of Gaza, the majority of them women and children. Innocent people continue to be killed because of the fighting, and many are dying of hunger and the spread of infectious disease.

The ability of aid organizations to attend to the critical needs of the victims of this prolonged war has also been sharply limited by the lack of meaningful negotiations. On February 29, starving Palestinians were fired upon as they sought food from an aid truck, with more than 100 persons killed by Israeli forces. It is estimated that 1.8 million Palestinians have been displaced, their homes and communities destroyed. The United Nations estimates that more than half a million people are living under "catastrophic levels of deprivation and starvation."

We believe that the current military strategy of the Israeli government, supported by U.S. weapons transfers and aid, will only lead to the destruction of the entire Gaza Strip, an unconscionable death toll that grows daily, the perpetuation of one of the world's longest conflicts, and the proliferation of increased enmity between Israelis and Palestinians, which has historically led to an increase in the militarization on both sides. There is no peace to be found in this strategy.

The lack of a true cease-fire after more than five months of this deadly conflict compels us to raise our voices now. We call for an immediate and permanent cease-fire in the Gaza Strip and a commitment from all involved parties, including Israel, Palestinians, surrounding Middle East countries, the U.S., and others to pursue a lasting peace.

We pledge our prayers and commitment to work for a durable peace, an end to the violence and the release of the hostages.


