#### "The Good News"

All churches want younger people to be participants in their active faith community, but not all churches understand the unique characteristics of younger generations. According to Pew Research Center, the generations can be understood as the Silent Generation (born between 1928-1945), the Baby Boomers (born between 1946-1964), Generation X (born between 1965-1980), Millennials (born between 1981-1996), and Generation Z (born between 1997-2012). They say Gen Z is the most racially and ethnically diverse generation in US. history.

Earlier this year I took a workshop from a seminary in Indiana that focused specifically on Gen Z (current 11–26-year-olds), led by Allison McFarland. Though sociological generalizations don't describe each person in a group, it can open up some windows of understanding. Here's a sampling of what I learned:

Members of Gen Z want firm and clear beliefs. They have evolving views about sexuality. They spend an average of six hours/day online (but they recognize the negative effects) and spend less time with traditional media. Gen Zers are the first generation that has had devices since infancy, yet, it's interesting that Gen Zers prefer face to face communication (rather than texting). They spend more of their leisure time alone (as opposed to Millennials who tend to congregate). They view parents as protectors (not friends). They often tend to the needs of others, to the detriment of self (they need help setting healthy boundaries). Gen Zers are more likely than Millennials to guestion orthodoxy

and faith traditions. They are unlikely to regularly attend religious services.

YET, 81% of Gen Z youth and 74 % of Gen Z adults say they're curious about scripture.

We are so blessed to have Rachel Conover and her colleagues to intentionally minister to this age group in our church. But all of us can play a role in the way we support our ministry to youth and engage with the adults in that generation. If we see a Gen Z person at a church event, make a point of warmly welcoming that person and showing interest in them. They just might come back.
