#### "The Good News"

As I was running my 26.2-mile marathon in Mesa, Arizona last month, I tried to distract my thoughts away from my aching muscles by reading the handmade signs that hundreds of spectators held as they cheered for us from the sidewalks. Signs like: "Run like the cops are chasing you!", or "Run faster, this sign is getting heavy!" or "You're almost there! . . . Just kidding". One sign that was repeated several times read: "Remember, You Signed Up for This!"

Ouch – that one was true. Signing up for this meant I was willing to begin a training discipline that began in October and took me into the cold, snow, and ice of winter into early February. I trained at various speeds and distances for a total of over 300 miles, which was about 100 miles shy of what I should have done. Still, I did my best with what I prepared for. The results didn't meet my highest goals, though I did beat my Denver marathon time from last year.

The Christian journey is certainly like a marathon. When things don't go well, or when we lose the habit of spiritual discipline, a voice inside of us may say, "Remember, you signed up for this!" At that moment you can either regret your situation, or pray that God will help you endure another spiritual mile and realize you ARE grateful that you signed up for this journey of faith.

The 40 days of Lent offers us a marathontype opportunity to recommit ourselves to disciplines of worship, bible study, prayer, and service. Sometimes it helps to join others on this journey.

Our Ash Wednesday worship will be at Trinity UMC in Yorkville March 5<sup>th</sup> when our choirs will combine to share special music. Perhaps you'd like to participate in my Monday night class "The Message of Jesus" that continues to Holy Week (sign up in the Gathering Room or contact the church office). Perhaps you'd be attracted to choose a 40-day devotional to do at home. Many are available online. One I can suggest entitled "Good Enough - 40ish Devotionals for a Life of Imperfection" by Kate Bowler, or her newest one "The Hardest Part". You can find them at www.katebowler.com

The discipline of running means I need to lace up my sneakers even when I don't feel like it, but I almost never regret the experience of the run that follows. A discipline of Lent means you will open your bible, pause to pray, read an inspirational book, worship with others, or serve others in need . . . even when you don't feel like it. I suspect that when you do it anyway, you won't regret the experience.

Join us for the journey.




During the month of March, we will be collecting items for Mutual Ground. A bin will be placed in the Gathering Room with a list of the most requested items. Thank you for your




