We can read in the 8th Psalm: “When I look at your heavens, the work of your fingers, the moon and the stars that you have established; what are human beings that you are mindful of them, mortals that you care for them? Yet you have made them a little lower than God (or “angels”) and crowned them with glory and honor.”

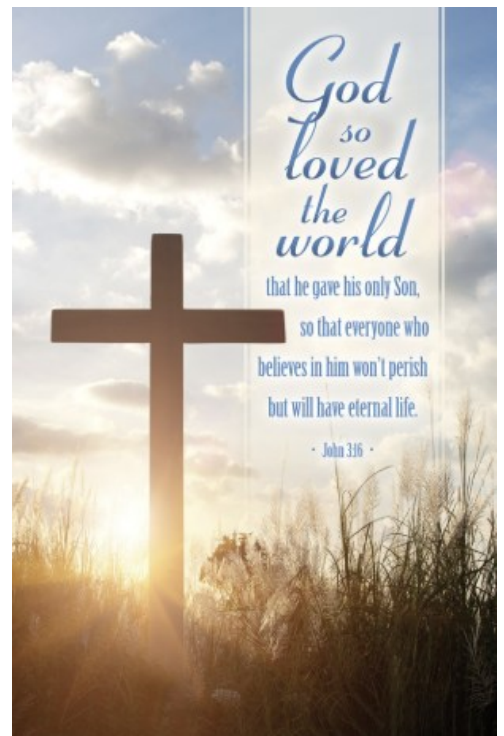

As Esther Perel notes, we are all flawed through our humanness, but at the same time, we can love ourselves at this point in our journey. We can “hold ourselves in high regard” even as we seek to continue mature in our understandings of self and the world around us. After all, scripture also reminds us “For God so loved the world (that includes you!!) that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life” (John 3:16)

Only when we are grounded in this proper self-love can we respond to the second part of Jesus’ Great Commandment: “You shall love your neighbor as yourself” (Mt. 22:39)

May one of your New Year’s resolutions be to humbly but confidently “hold yourself in high regard” because you know God loves you, and thus you can love yourself. From that beautiful position, just imagine what God has in store for you in 2026. . .
