“The Good News”

As we prepare for our October 1st pastoral transition, I thought you'd like to know more about Pastor Doh (pronounced like “dough”). I gleaned some of his life story from his own writings. He has had a very full life as a pastor, husband, and father.

Eunbae Doh has always known the life of a pastor – his father was a Korean Methodist minister in Korea for 50 years! Eunbae followed in his father's footsteps and earned a Master of Theology degree at Methodist University in Seoul. Later, he earned a Master of Arts in Religious Communication at United Theological Seminary in Dayton, Ohio (a United Methodist school founded by the father of the Wright Brothers!)

Pastor Doh is also a Certified Conflict Mediator, “a credential that reflects my belief that the church, at its best, is a place of reconciliation.”

He also learned about life outside of the classroom. Pastor Doh served for three years as a chaplain in the Republic of Korea Army, “ministering to soldiers who were young, often far from home, and carrying burdens no one should have to carry alone. . . I sat with men in their grief, counseled families in crisis, and offered the sacraments in places that were anything but sacred in appearance. I learned that pastoral care is not a program – it is a presence. You show up. You listen. You stay.”

After his army service, Pastor Doh served a 10,000 member Methodist church in Korea, leading their Christian Education ministry responsible for 1,500 children and 200 volunteer teachers.

For over two decades in Northern Illinois, Pastor Doh has pastored United Methodist churches in St. Charles, Stockton, Arlington Heights, Channahon, and Naperville. He says, “I am a storyteller by nature . . . For me, the Gospel has never been abstract. It is always about people. . . Every story matters. I am always ready to listen to your story.”

Pastor Doh is blessed with a loving family: his wife Sunghee, his three adult children, and their dog Sadie. In October, Pastor Doh and Good Shepherd will be a blessing for each other.

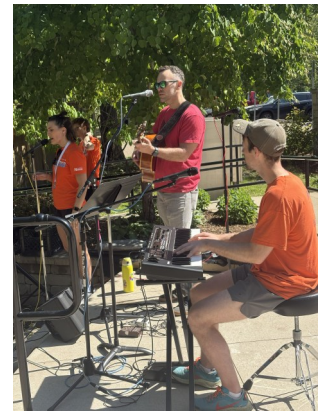

Thankyou for supporting our Global 6k for Water

On May 16th, under warm blue skies, 23 walkers/runners and 8 volunteers enjoyed the fellowship and common cause as they moved along the beautiful Fox River trail to raise money and awareness for people who need permanent access to clean water around the world. Guitar, keyboard, and vocals were heard from Jon Conover, Tom Hartness, and Elaine Green. We removed our caps for a moving rendition of The Star Spangled Banner from Good Shepherd's Brianna DeStefano. Smiling volunteers at two water aid stations kept us encouraged and hydrated. We raised over \$2,000 so that women and children would not have to walk miles from home to retrieve a heavy load of water in buckets, often from unclean sources. Through the Christian organization World Vision, wells are drilled, natural springs are capped, water is piped, and sanitation stations are created. As a result, children don't have to skip school, women have time to earn a living, and family members stay protected from water-borne diseases.

We were part of a larger effort that took place in towns all across the U.S. that day, totaling 440 events, made up of 14,337 participants, who raised \$1,652,636.00 to provide access to clean water for 33,053 people. Praise God for such a joyful and effective ministry!
