A few weeks ago I spent a few days in Chicago at the National Leadership Gathering with several hundred World Vision volunteers from all over the United States. World Vision is a Christian organization who, among other things, is the world's largest provider of clean water outside of government entities.

What we had in common is our desire to

What we had in common is our desire to serve Christ by serving the most vulnerable – which are the children and women who daily walk an average of 6 Kilometers (3.7 miles) to find a water source (usually dirty or disease-laden water) so they can carry a heavy bucket-full back to their family for drinking, cooking, washing, and bathing.

At break time, I would get a drink out of a water fountain and wash my hands at a sink, without even thinking if the water was clean, or if there was enough of it. I started to become more thankful for the safety of my water, for it's plentiful supply, and for the fact that I only need to walk a few feet rather than miles to get it. I started wondering, if I didn't have running water, how far would I have to walk to find a clean, reliable source of water? And how much could I really carry in one trip?

I realized that my efforts to transform the lives of others is what creates transformation in me. Jesus knew this when he asked his disciples "Do you love me?" And when their answer was "Yes", he told them "Feed my sheep". Jesus knew that in our giving and our receiving we are the ones who are the most transformed.

Church of the Good Shepherd is hosting a World Vision Global 6K walk/run in Oswego on Saturday morning, May 20th starting at Hudson Crossing Park downtown by the Fox River. We would love to have you and your family/friends be part of this transforming experience for yourself and for children and women in need of clean, accessible, life-transforming water. It will be a <u>fun morning</u> to connect with others and enjoy the beauty of nature. It will be a <u>memorable</u> event where we can practice our faith by caring for those who can't care for us. It will be <u>empowering</u> for us knowing that, with our efforts to bring clean water, it creates an environment that also generates health, jobs, security, and hope for the future.

Water stations and portable toilets will be on the route as we go to Violet Patch Park and back. Our Reborn praise band will provide music before and after the walk/run. https://global6k.worldvision.org/index.cfm? fuseac-



The Missions Team has been busy over the last month, and we're excited to share with you what we've been up to!

First, were thrilled to receive \$50.00 collected by our generous Sunday School students and families during their January collection drive for **Grace Children's Hospital** in Haiti. That donation was matched by a mem-

ber of the congregation, bringing the total to \$100.00 collected for this Mission Links project! Along with the donation, the Sunday School students made a variety of coloring sheets to send along to the children who are patients in the hospital. We are grateful to Ruth Frey and all the Sunday School teachers for promoting this and bringing joy into the lives of the children in the hospital!



We also decided where to direct the \$856.42 we were tithed from the Finance Committee. We did not take this decision lightly, as we know that we only have these funds because of the incredible generosity of this congregation. Ultimately, after some discussion, we determined that we would divide the money three ways:

- \$285.47: **NIC District Project: Hesed House PADS**. We selected this because it is one of our Mission Links projects this year, and we are building an on-going relationship with Hesed House through serving their Family Shelter throughout the year. WHO IS WORLD VISION?

World Vision is a Christian humanitarian organization dedicated to working with children, families, and their communities worldwide to reach their full potential by tackling the causes of poverty and injustice. World Vision is the largest non-governmental provider of clean water in the world bringing sustainable clean water to a new person every 10 seconds.

WHY IS IT A 6K INSTEAD OF A 5K?

Six kilometers, or 3.7 miles, is the average distance a person in the developing world has to walk to find water—water that is often not safe to drink or wash their hands with. We want to help you make that fact personal by covering that same distance so that someone else no longer has to.

WHY DOES THIS RACE COST \$50?

Through World Vision water projects, \$50 will provide clean water for one person. Your \$50 registration fee goes directly to that! That means every 6K for Water participant equals clean water for another person in a developing country. Kids 18 years and under can register for \$25.

WHERE WILL MY MONEY GO?

The registration fees and donations from World Vision's Global 6K for Water will help fund water projects, like handwashing stations, in communities where World Vision works.

CAN KIDS PARTICIPATE?

Yes! We want families and children to participate in this event. Children of all ages can register as a participant to run or walk the 6K distance. Plus, kids 18 years and younger get to register for \$25!


