Witnessing the baptism of others causes us to reflect on our own faith journey and seek to experience God's grace in significant ways. Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ

July 2025

Here is an update on how the church General Fund finances stand through the first half of 2025.

To date, contributions to the General Fund, which pays all regular expenses, are about \$10,000 behind last year, a decrease of about 6.6%. This is nearly 14% below the contributions planned for in the annual operating budget. These results are disappointing and have an impact on the timely payment of some expenses as shown below. It's important to note that the people at Good Shepherd continue to respond to special humanitarian needs with significant donations for specific causes like the recent appeals for assistance for the Pens family and UMCOR relief for victims of the Texas floods.

Total payroll and other normal operating and administrative costs (after our property insurance prepayment) are about 3.6% higher than last year, slightly better than the 4.5% increase anticipated in the budget. Due to the significantly lower level of contributions, funds from the 2024 surplus have been utilized to stay current on payroll and other bills. Our apportionment obligation is 3 months behind and some of what has been paid required use of additional 2024 surplus funds. At this point, about 95% of the 2024 excess has been utilized, leaving us about \$1,200 for use later this year. The increases in various expenses are likely to continue as we progress through 2025. We are hopeful that we will see significantly increased regular contributions soon which will allow us to stay current on all regular bills and get up to date on apportionment too. Our outstanding staff, along with all church committees, continue to be very cost conscious in everything they do. This gives us great assurance that we will be able to stay well within our budgeted costs as we move through the second half of 2025.

As new opportunities for the church beyond conducting regular weekly worship services arise, we must be ready to provide adequate support. Our history gives us confidence in the ability of the church to support all of its various programs in every way needed. As activity grows, more people from the community that are seeking to build a relationship with the Lord will also be drawn to the church and contributions will grow from there.

The contributions that you make to the General Fund in person, through the mail, and through egiving are needed and very much appreciated. Some may want to utilize a portion of their required
minimum distribution (RMD) from an IRA to provide funds to contribute to the church. If you are doing
this, consider having your IRA custodian submit it directly to the church as a Qualified Charitable
Distribution (QCD) which could potentially reduce your federal tax obligation. Have your financial
planner contact the office for deposit instructions for a QCD. You can get an updated contribution
statement showing your progress in supporting the church by contacting the office as well. Please
prayerfully consider continuing, or even increasing, your contributions as your personal finances allow.
With everyone's help, your Church will stay up to date with all its expenses, continue to retain our
valuable staff, and continue to bring the Lord's message to everyone.


