### "The Good News"

In the chilly darkness I walked across the big wooden pedestrian bridge shared by dog walkers, cyclists, baby strollers, and runners. Strangers gave a nod or a smile to each other. Friends carried on lively conversations. Dogs barked. The only decoration were huge wooden letters facing away from the bridge on one of its sides, lit by bright light bulbs, spelling: "Peace on Earth". Indeed, I experienced a modest but real peace on that old bridge, as I witnessed people showing kindness and respect to one another, people of all ages and many ethnicities, speaking several languages, yet co-existing in a mutual demonstration of peace on earth. I felt it as a humble but significant demonstration of God's will for how we are to share our space and life together on God's good earth.

Indeed, we seek to demonstrate something similar at Good Shepherd, to be the light of Christ, the Prince of Peace, whose birth we celebrate this month. I invite you to join the assembly as we celebrate the One who, in his earthly life, experienced what it's like to be lonely and misunderstood, to be an immigrant and an outcast, to be seen as a criminal and a threat. Come and celebrate this one who also is known as a healer, a peacemaker, a justicepromoter, and a dispenser of love and forgiveness: the Son of God, Jesus Christ.

Come celebrate as we open the church to the community for our annual Nativity Scene display and Chili Supper on December 5<sup>th</sup>, as we share the Lord's Supper on Sunday December 7 during morning worship, as the children act out their Christmas program on December

14<sup>th</sup> at 9 am, as we pursue our adult Advent study on biblical nativity stories on Monday nights, as hear our choir sing the Christmas Cantata December 21<sup>st</sup> at 8:30 am, and as we gather on Christmas Eve at 7pm and 11 pm for our candlelight worship.

Wherever we are, may be experience and demonstrate the peace on earth that Christ seeks to bring.


# Merry Christmas!




This year's Christmas Cantata will be Sunday, December 21 at the 8:30 Worship service.

I admit that I have a tough time adjusting to the increasing days of darkness, when the sun seems to set with a suddenness that always surprises me and causes me to long for those longer daylight hours. It's a season that reminds many of loss rather than gain, bringing to mind what we once had and no longer experience. I believe this is one reason the approach to Christmas is harder on some than on others.

As the darkness steadily increases and the light decreases, the calendar moves ever close to the shortest day of the year, the winter equinox on December 21<sup>st</sup>. It's an important seasonal day that pivots us from increasing darkness to increasing light. Spiritually, it fits perfectly with the coming of Jesus, the light of the world whose birth we celebrate at Christmas. John the Baptist said of Jesus "He must increase, but I must decrease" (John 3:30)

As we move toward Christmas, may we anticipate the increase not only of daylight, but of Christ's influential increase in our lives.

In this time, I invite you to put yourselves in places where you can experience Christ's influence, as we gather at Good Shepherd for meaningful worship, beautiful music, a delicious chili supper, meditation around nativity scenes in the sanctuary, learning with others during Advent bible study, compassionate service to others and joyful fellowship.

As an expression of your thanksgiving for the Light of the World, God's increasing presence in your life, you may send your Advent/Christmas offering to the church in-person, by mail, or by e-giving. Consider also a gift of love to the Salvation Army, which you can separately designate.

God bless you as you navigate the darkness while anticipating the light of Christ's healing and saving presence.




