"The Good News"

It's the fall season, and Good Shepherd is anticipating some wonderful events and ministries that we will share with each other. They will be experiences of compassion, justice, and mercy – faith, hope and love.

Rally Day is September 7th, the day when our Sunday School teachers will welcome their students for a new season of learning and growth. Our One Achord Choir and the Joyful Noise Handbells resume their rehearsal and singing/ playing schedule. We look forward to more people on Sunday mornings to sing, pray, and grow with. Our Fellowship Team resumes it's delicious monthly Sunday brunch in the Fellowship Hall on Sept. 14th, the same day that our Sunday School will offer the Blessing of the Backpacks. In October our Missions Committee will invite us to gather downstairs to assemble Personal Dignity Kits to be shared with those in need through the Midwest Mission Distribution Center. Our Little Shepherd Preschool is starting their new school year.

These are the experiences that inspire us to help create and participate in the Beloved Community known as the church. These are opportunities to live out our biblical learnings to love God and to love our neighbor as ourselves.

Rev. Adam Hamilton calls these expressions the "major chords" of biblical teaching. The church being the church as we seek to follow God's will as understood through scripture, tradition, experience, and reason (the "quadrilateral" of Methodist teachings).

Pastor Adam contrasts this with the "minor chords" of scripture, that is, troubling verses that have been historically used to support slavery, suppress the leadership role of women, harm children, and deny full inclusion to people in the LGBTQ+ community. The number of bible verses used to promote these things are very small, and do not line up with the larger themes of scripture, including the teachings of Jesus himself. They are often seen to reflect societal customs or the culture of ancient times rather than being a reflection of God's Nonetheless, these "minor chords" been used throughout history to hurt or harm people in irreparable ways.

When we lean into the major chords of biblical truth, we support one another, we listen, forgive, lend a hand, show compassion, pray, make right, offer hope, practice healing, love one another, and grow in Christ. Let's take a big breath and dedicate ourselves to living out these principles of our faith this fall, and remember to tell one another – welcome! It's good to see you again.

Apple Sauce, Apple Squares, Fruit, Apple Cider Donuts and more!




