Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

2026 marks the 10th year that I have been honored to serve as your pastor at Church of the Good Shepherd. This also marks the 39th year of my full-time pastoral ministry in churches of our Northern Illinois Conference. I am so blessed to be serving with you at such a healthy and vibrant church. However, I have decided that 2026 is the right time for me to retire.

Following our United Methodist protocol, I made a formal retirement request to our District Superintendent Rev. Wendy Hardin Hermann and to our Bishop Dan Schwerin. Once the Bishop approved my retirement request, Pastor Wendy helped me share the news with our Staff Parish Relations Committee (SPRC). Several days later, SPRC Chair Pat Harmon helped me share the news during worship on Sunday January 25th. Our SPRC will continue to be in conversation with D.S. Wendy Hardin Hermann to share a profile of our church and the qualities needed in the next pastor who will be appointed to serve at Church of the Good Shepherd.

At this time, it is unclear when my last day will be at Good Shepherd. I will retire from pastoral ministry on September 30, 2026, but, due to the complexities of securing the best leadership for my replacement, there is a slight chance that I will have to be an interim pastor elsewhere for a short time before my requested retirement date.

As I have cared for you, I have felt your care for me. It's difficult to leave a place where I feel accepted and loved, but that also points to the character of Good

new pastor with open arms while continuing to be a welcoming, inclusive, loving family of faith. Eight months is a very long time to say “Goodbye”, but we will be emotionally and organizationally prepared for this pastoral transition. Our wonderful staff and committee leaders will continue the work and ministry of the church, which is part of what makes Good Shepherd such a strong and committed band of disciples of Jesus Christ.

I look forward to further sharing with you as we help each other to nurture and grow this body of Christ known as Church of the Good Shepherd UMC.

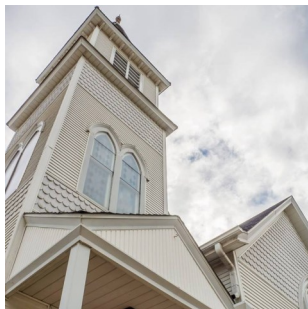

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ

January, 2026

Here's the Church financial results for 2025. After some ups and downs early in the year, General Fund contributions showed modest month to month improvement through November bringing us close to prior year levels. December was a great month, allowing us to finish the year with total general fund contributions about 2.5% higher than 2024. Thanks to all for their generous contributions and outstanding support of the Church!

Our normal operating and administrative costs (excluding insurance prepayment impact), payroll expenses, and apportionment were, in total, about 8.3% higher than 2024 levels. We had increases in many different operating expenses, most significantly utilities, along with the approved staff payroll increases. Staff members continued to adjust work schedules and responsibilities to accommodate changes in worship schedule requirements, building use, and other revised work requirements. The trustees and other church committees continued their exceptional dedication to controlling their expense obligations. The results of their efforts were outstanding! We are fortunate to have so many great, dedicated people associated with our Church! By the end of August, we had used up the excess funds carried over from 2024 to stay current with our obligations. With contributions continuing to improve slightly from September through November, and the strong contributions received in December, we concluded the year with all expenses, including conference apportionment, paid in full. We also had excess general fund contributions of about \$29,000. Finance voted to provide \$500 to the Handbell Choir dedicated account, \$2,000 to major maintenance for known outstanding bills, and 10% of the balance to our Mission Team for them to redistribute to worthy missions of their choice. The remaining excess will roll back into the Church's dedicated general funds to cover bills in the New Year.

What can we expect in 2026? Our 2026 budget forecasts increased total expenses due to pay increases being provided to staff, along with continued increases in some specific operating and administrative areas. Our anticipation is that income from contributions will be sufficient to offset these increased expenses. The response to November's annual request to provide 2026 "Estimates of Giving" has been great, showing estimated contributions about 10% higher than the estimates received last year. Having these estimates provides significant help in our ability to responsibly manage church finances. If you have not yet provided one, it can still be done by contacting the church office. We continue to see more people in church! Sundays are busy with two Sunday morning services, Sunday School, gathering room and Fellowship Hall hospitality, and regular youth group activities after the second service. Online worship is still available along with many other church programs. This provides many ways to become more personally involved with the Church. The contributions that you make on a regular basis in person, through the mail, by using Zeffy e-giving, or using other methods, are needed and very much appreciated! Please prayerfully consider continuing, or even increasing them as personal finances allow. With everyone's help, your Church will continue to stay up to date with all its expenses, have funds available to make improvements, continue to retain our valuable staff, and continue to bring the Lord's message to everyone.
